The School Day

Eardisley CofE Primary School currently offers total weekly hours of 32.5 for compulsory attendance.

The School gates open at 8.40am.

School finishes at 3.20pm for both Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2.

Applying to come here

Once you decide you would like a place in Reception or at any other time after this, you must make a formal application. You can do this by applying to the Local Authority and not direct to the school.

For the Normal Round intake into school, children are offered places to start in Reception at the beginning of the September term after their fourth birthday. Children who are admitted to a vacancy at any time after this point are called 'Out of Year' Admissions.

A World Class Curriculum

We strive to give our children the best. Through vibrant curriculum experiences, Eardisley CE Primary School aims to ensure that its children are equipped with the skills, attitudes, knowledge and understanding they need to excel and successfully navigate the ever-changing demands of their world. More about the curriculum

The National Curriculum identifies three 'core' subjects that form a major part of the school's teaching programme. These are English, Maths and Science. In addition, there are 'foundation' subjects of History, Geography, Art and Design, Computing, Religious Education, Music, Design and Technology and Physical Education. These are generally taught as distinct subjects but wherever possible links are made between them so that children can see how aspects interrelate.

At Eardisley CE Primary School we follow the National Curriculum but seek to educate more broadly and beyond its limits wherever possible, we offer Personal, Social and Health Education, Philosophy for Children, Global Education and whole-class and individual instrumental tuition. In addition, we offer a rich variety of opportunities for sport, drama and the performing arts.

Careful long and medium term planning by staff ensures that there is continuity and progression in the children's learning and that work is appropriately differentiated for their needs.

The professional expertise of the staff at Eardisley CE Primary School is constantly developed through reflection and professional development opportunities. For the staff, as for their children, education is a continuous and life-long learning process.

Assessment

We are very proud of all our children who worked so hard to achieve these results for the year 2024 2025.

Early Years Foundation Stage (15 children): 60% of children in the Early Years achieved a good level of development (68% National).

Year 1 Phonics (17 children): 65% children met the screening test (80% National).

Good attendance and punctuality remain a top priority for us at Eardisley CE Primary School. Working in partnership with parents and carers ensures children have the best chance to achieve their academic potential and have a real opportunity in further education and the world of work. It will also enable children to:

- Access the lessons needed to achieve their expected grades
- Maintain friendships and develop new ones
- Have access to social and sporting events offered by the school
- Explore potential life skills
- Develop world habits such as good punctuality which are essential to thrive in the world of employment.

We strive to ensure the children have the best opportunities to be the best they can be, to feel safe and supported in school, and to develop a sense of belonging both with their peers and as a wider part of our school community. To support that, regular attendance will be key.

Giving your child the best start

90% attendance may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, however in reality that means your child misses half a day of school every week, the equivalent of 19 school days (almost one whole month), during the year. Children who miss this amount of school do not achieve as well as their peers who attend more regularly.

We expect all pupils at Eardisley CE Primary School to attend school as regularly as possible. Our ambition for every child is 100% attendance.

We recognise that on occasion some children may experience illness or have exceptional reasons preventing regular attendance. To assist parents deciding whether their child is too ill to attend school or otherwise, the NHS have produced a guide that you may find useful:

We know being a parent/carer can be challenging at times and we are here to help if there are any problems affecting your child. We will work with you to ensure any identified barriers are discussed so we can best support your child's wellbeing and education. All schools work closely with Early Help, Health and the Local Authority teams who may also be able to help if needed.

As parents/carers you can best support your child to secure regular attendance and punctuality by:

- Ensuring a good bedtime routine to enable your child to get enough sleep.
- Establishing a good routine each evening and each morning so your child is prepared for the school day ahead.
- Making sure your child attends school every day it is open, unless there is an exceptional reason preventing this.
- Ensuring your child arrives at school on time every day by 8.50 am
- Arranging dental and medical appointments outside school hours wherever possible, where this is not possible ensure your child attends before and returns promptly afterwards.
- Informing the school if your child is ill and too unwell to attend.
- Taking absence seriously – if your child is not wanting to attend, or has not attended as you expected why is this? Are they putting themselves at risk – Who are they with? What are they doing? Do you know who they are talking to online?
- Taking any holidays during school holiday periods, and not during term time - If children are taken out of school for a one-week holiday every year and have an average number of days off for sickness and medical appointments, then by the time they finish Year 11, they will have missed the equivalent of two entire terms of schooling.
- Talking positively to your child about school and taking an interest in their school day.
- Attending parents' evenings and school events.
- Praising and rewarding your child's efforts and achievements at school.
- Supporting school staff by working in partnership to best manage and support your child with any difficult or challenging behaviour or circumstances.
- Discussing any problems or difficulties with the school as soon as they arise – staff are here to help.

We look forward to working in partnership with you to support your child's education.

Behaviour

Eardisley CE Primary School has a well-established reputation for excellent behaviour and for the quality of relationships between children, and between children and staff. We believe that effective learning and positive relationships go hand in hand.

At Eardisley CE Primary School, we aim to make school life a positive, enjoyable experience by providing an environment that is friendly, caring and secure. Confidence and self-esteem are nurtured in both children and adults through an emphasis on mutual respect, kindness and consideration for others.

Children are encouraged to be polite, respectful and responsible at all times. They learn about positive behaviour in assemblies and lessons, and adults take every opportunity to model and reinforce high standards. Good behaviour is recognised and celebrated through verbal praise, acknowledgement, house points, weekly Merit Certificates and Values Awards. Children contribute to creating and upholding their class rules and our School Values, and they understand the rewards and consequences linked to them.

The school environment is one where any form of bullying or vandalism is unacceptable and not tolerated. Wherever possible, strategies for addressing behavioural issues are positive, supportive and appropriate to the child's age and needs.

We follow a restorative practice approach, helping children to reflect on what happened, understand the impact of their actions, repair harm and restore relationships. The focus is on learning, responsibility and empathy rather than blame. When consequences are needed, they are fair, proportionate and linked to opportunities for reparation.

Where concerns about a child's behaviour persist, we work in partnership with parents. A joint, consistent approach is always in the child's best interests.

GDPR

Details of pupils' addresses and contact numbers, together with academic records and other information, are kept on the school's database. In accordance with the Data Protection Act parents have a right of access to all of this information on written request. A copy of our Privacy Notice is on the school website.

For safeguarding reasons, we do ask that parents and carers taking photographs at school events, such as productions, services, Sports Day and sporting fixtures, respect the privacy of all families and only post pictures of their own children on social networking and other internet sites.

School Meals

Our school lunches are provided by The Royal Oak, Gladestry. The lunches are served in our School Hall and the children are supported by Mid-Day Supervisors.

We encourage children to eat with a knife and fork and develop their social skills as they talk and eat together.

The lunches are freshly prepared daily using local and seasonal ingredients where possible.

Children are able to choose from a meat/fish course or a vegetarian course. Desserts are mostly home-made. Bread is available daily. Packed lunches can, of course, be brought in from home if parents prefer.

All Key Stage 1 pupils (Reception, Years 1 & 2) receive free school meals.

The cost of a school meal for Key Stage 2 children (Years 3, 4, 5 & 6) is **£2.85**. Meals should be booked and paid for in advance via ParentPay.

School Milk

Children have the opportunity to purchase milk from Cool Milk. Details will be provided by the School Office. Children under 5 and on benefit-related Free School Meals are eligible for free milk.

Snacks

We encourage healthy eating and provide each infant child with a piece of fruit, such as an apple, orange or pear each day as a snack.

Free School Meals

The Department for Education (DfE) has announced that free school meals (FSM) eligibility will be extended to all households receiving Universal Credit from September 2026.

The key changes include:

- **Increased Eligibility:** The previous £7,400 annual earnings cap for Universal Credit claimants has been removed. If you receive any level of Universal Credit, your child is eligible for free lunches.
- **Two New Eligibility Tiers:** The system now features
 - Targeted FSM (households earning £7,400 or less) and
 - Expanded FSM (households earning above £7,400).

We encourage **every family** to apply to apply for Free School Meals (even if you are in receipt of Universal Free School Meals **UFSM** (ie in Years R, 1 and 2) to see if you are eligible.

Why are we encouraging families to apply even if their child receives a UFSM?

- **Targeted FSM:** If children are eligible for Targeted FSM, it entitles them to additional financial support for the school day, such as subsidies for educational trips, extracurricular activities, music lessons and school uniform.

Targeted FSM registration directly drives the Pupil Premium funding schools receive. This means more resources for our school, including targeted tuition, teaching assistants, and wellbeing programs.

- **Expanded FSM:** If children are eligible for Expanded FSM, it entitles them to a free school meal only.

We are happy to help: We can help you fill out the form privately without judgment should you want assistance.

Privacy concerns: Please be reassured that the application and meal-collecting processes are completely confidential, children have no way of knowing who receives FSM.

Medical

Administration of Medicines

Should your child need to have medicines or inhalers administered during the school day, please call at the office and complete our medicine form and leave the medicine with the office staff. Please collect the medicine yourself at the end of the day.

If your child is asthmatic, you will be required to complete our asthma form.

If your child has any form of medical condition that could affect them in school or could require a particular form of treatment of care, please let us know. Information will be treated as confidential.

Illnesses and Accidents

If a child becomes ill during the school day, we will contact parents or carers so that s/he can be taken home. If a child has an accident in school any necessary first aid will be carried out by one of our staff first aid certificate holders. Whenever a child receives a significant injury, full details are recorded in the accident book and parents are informed through a letter or phone call. If it is felt that the child should receive further medical attention, parents will be contacted immediately.

School Nursing Team

If your child has a problem that is likely to affect your child's schooling, the school nurse may be able to help. She is also there to help if you have any other concerns about your child's health or development at any time while your child is attending school. In the first year of school your child will have a vision test, offered vaccinations and in Year One a hearing test. Your child may also be weighed or measured. The school nurse may contact parents individually after these tests if necessary. If you have any concerns about any of these procedures, please do discuss these with the school nurse.

Parental Engagement

We operate a welcoming 'open door' policy, positively encouraging the co-operation and close involvement of parents. We want to learn more about your children from you, and to discuss ways in which you can help and encourage your child in all aspects of education. Before enrolment, parents are invited to bring their children to visit to meet the staff and familiarise themselves with the school. Children are invited to spend several sessions with us during the half term prior to officially starting school.

A weekly newsletter provides current information and news. The newsletters are sent out each Friday by email and are also available on the school website.

Many parents work voluntarily in the school on a regular basis and/or respond generously to specific requests for help if they cannot make a regular commitment. Any help with activities such as reading, cooking, art and craft work, maths games and preparing resources is very much appreciated.

If you would like to become involved in any way, we would be delighted! Please talk to your child's class teacher and we will arrange for a DBS check to be put in place. We also welcome any parents who want to come and spend some time in school to find out what goes on!

Parents' Evenings

Formal parents' evening to discuss your child's progress and targets are held each term. In the Spring term, your child will receive an Annual Report which is sent out prior to the spring term parents' evening and which gives an overview of progress and next steps in all the curriculum areas.

In addition to this, you are welcome to meet informally with your child's class teacher or the headteacher, either at the beginning or end of the school day, or by a prior arrangement on almost any day.

We aim to hold regular curriculum workshops to keep parents informed about educational development and to give ideas for how to help children at home.

Eardisley CE Primary School we view education as a partnership with parents and the wider community and we celebrate the fact that education is a two-way process between home and school. In this way, we all work together to enhance school life and maintain an environment of enjoyment and achievement. We are delighted to have a core of parent volunteer class helpers who support children's learning on a regular basis.

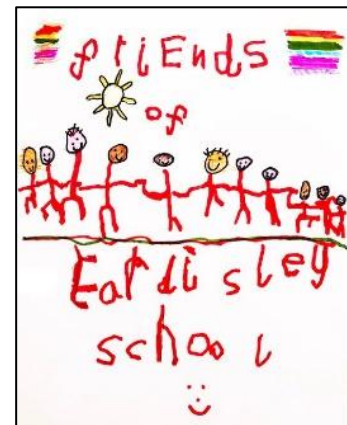

Eardisley CE Primary School is a truly inclusive school. All our staff ensure that every child is offered the opportunity to achieve their full potential, including those with Special Educational Needs (SEN).

A child has special educational needs if he or she has difficulties or disabilities that make it harder for them to learn than most other children of about the same age in a mainstream school. Some children will need extra help and support from us for some or all of their time at Eardisley CE Primary School and we are always happy to help, both directly and through accessing a wide range of external support and expertise.

Transport

Transport is organised by Herefordshire Council in some cases. The service will run at the beginning and the end of the normal school day and no transport is available for out-of-hours activities. They will provide home to school transport if your child is attending their nearest school and:

- They live over three miles from school (over two miles if they're under eight), or
- They have income-based free school meals and live over two miles from school, or
- Their route to school is less than three miles, but too dangerous to walk even when accompanied

If you don't qualify for free transport you may be eligible for the Vacant Seat Payment Scheme. If the council has a spare seat on a bus they may be able to 'sell' that seat to you in return for a termly contribution.

If your application is approved a bus pass will be sent to school for collection on the first day of term. You will need to meet the allocated bus at a stop along its existing route, and travel between home and the stop remains the responsibility of parents.

Uniform

The Eardisley CE Primary School uniform is smart, yet practical. We make every effort to keep costs as reasonable as possible. We believe a uniform looks smart, is appropriate for school activities, gives children a sense of belonging and avoids discrimination on the grounds of appearance.

Please ensure that all items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name.

School uniform consist of:

- Dark grey school trousers / shorts / skirt / pinafore dress
- Red polo shirt, preferably with the school badge
- Eardisley School red sweatshirt or cardigan with the school badge
- Black or grey socks / tights
- Black school shoes (not trainers)
- Red and white checked gingham dress (optional for summer)

Cost

The school makes every effort to keep costs as reasonable as possible. If there are any financial concerns regarding the cost of uniform, please do contact the school in confidence. For children in receipt of benefit-related Free School Meals, assistance to purchase uniform can be provided. Please contact the school office for further details.

PE Uniform

Children can wear their PE Kit Uniform to school on their allocated PE days. As such, the PE Kit Uniform should be worn smartly like the School Uniform, as children will be representing the school, helping to develop a sense of belonging and avoiding discrimination on the grounds of appearance.

Please ensure that all items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name.

PE Kit Uniform consists of:

- Eardisley School red PE hoodie or Eardisley School red sweatshirt
- Plain red round neck T shirt
- Plain black shorts / skort / joggers / sports leggings (no logos / stripes)
- Trainers or pumps
- Black or grey socks
- Long red football socks – for KS2 children
- Shin pads – for KS2 children
- Football boots – optional (KS2 children only)

Visits and Performances

Your child's class will go on educational outings during the school year to places of interest linked to the curriculum. The trips include museums, galleries and places of interest. Children in Year 3 and 4 can go on a residential trip every other year, whilst Year 5 and 6 goes every year in the Summer term. The children are given many opportunities

Financial Contributions

Financial Contributions It is the policy of the school governors to ask for voluntary contributions to the cost of swimming transport, educational visits and the cost of craft or cooking work when it is taken home. We ask that all payments are made through the online Parent Pay system where possible. Money or cheques arriving with children should be enclosed in an envelope with the child's name and class written clearly. Charges may be made for certain activities including those detailed below:

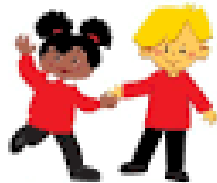
- Transport and entrance fees for trips and visits and board and lodging on residential visits. Families in receipt of income support are entitled to have these charges remitted.
- Costs associated with individual/group tuition in the playing of a musical instrument.
- Optional extras/activities which take place wholly or mainly outside school hours but which are not provided as part of a syllabus and are not required in order to fulfil statutory duties relating to the National Curriculum or Religious Education.
- Breakages: parents may be asked to pay for the cost of repair or replacement for breakages and damage caused by misbehaviour.

Cases of special need will be given sympathetic and confidential consideration on application to the Headteacher or governors. No child will be excluded from activities due to inability to pay.
